Hold a small mirror, or camera phone upside down to snap your home from a different point of view, imagining that you're walking on the walls and ceiling! Draw the shapes and angles that you find. Cut them out of tissue, newspaper, or any coloured paper that you can find and tape them to your window to create a new, temporary, street of colourful rooftop shapes, on your window.
